- The 3rd annual WSCC Academy was held in May 2025.
- District teams received tailored support to complete their USDA-required Local School Wellness Policy Triennial Assessment and action plan for sustainable change.
- A panel of district leaders shared successes and lessons learned related to teaming and implementation of evidence-based whole child policies and practices.
- · Districts attending the WSCC Academy have subsequent access to ongoing technical assistance through a statewide Community of Practice.
