Fast Hartford Middle School's **Empower Health Program**

- 15 minutes of dedicated time (Advisory period)
- On Mondays, all students in grades 6-8 participate in classroom activities based on the CASEL framework for social & emotional learning
- · On Tuesdays through Fridays, students engage in physical activity that reinforces the social and emotional learning in the classroom
- Implementation led by school WSCC Team

WSCC is the CDC's framework for addressing health in schools. It's studentcentered, emphasizing the role of the community and the use of evidence-based policies and practices.

The program promotes social & emotional climate by teaching CASEL-aligned social and emotional learning skills. It then offers students opportunities to apply these skills and engage in physical activity through team-based games and independent activities (e.g., soccer, football, jump rope, and gaga ball).



A recent survey of students and teachers highlights Empower Health's impact. For example, one student shared, "I love how the teachers thought of this for us." Another said, "This is something that I can use to let off some energy after class." Many students indicated that engaging in physical activity has helped them socially. An 8th grader mentioned, "Some of my friends are usually quiet but I get them to engage," while another said, "This has helped me make new friends."



One teacher remarked that this was "the best thing that has happened! Thank you all!"
